The **Delta Education team** has made the effort to ensure that the exam papers and memorandums have been compiled to an exceptionally high quality standard. Parents, please remember the examination procedures - they are very important. The exam papers are accompanied by their memorandums and are posted at no extra cost to you. **Parents are to handle the exams personally and protect the integrity of the papers.** Therefore it is your responsibility! In the event where papers are marked on the same day as the exam, the memorandum can serve as an excellent resource with regard to future studies.

**1. DELTA'S LEARNING MATERIAL**

Continuous improvement is our goal with regard to learning material. We continuously work through the learning material to ensure correct language, spelling, content and technical aspects. We have made a team of moderators and language specialists to ensure improvement through editing.

Currently, Delta and Impak boast with 365 different subjects. Each subject consists of a learner guide, parent guide, memorandum book, while some subjects are accompanied by DVD's - our total number of products available amount to 1230. With this many products available it takes us a considerable amount of time to edit the work for faults and mistakes. We are just as anxious as you to close this chapter of faults and errors. Please hold on a little longer, we are almost there.

## **2. SERVICE DELIVERY**

### **a. Challenges**

It is an honourable challenge to service our 5000 clients. The word "challenge" underlines the fact that we still have numerous gaps in our systems and that we are continually striving to reach perfection. This is by no means an excuse.

Last year we rendered services to 5000 enrolled clients. Due to poor service 447 went in search of greener pastures. Delta's management is concerned about every complaint. Complaints equal dissatisfactory service delivery. And this dissatisfaction can lead to cancellations. Cancellations are the foundation of a poor image and damage our reputation.

We prefer to listen to complaints, acknowledge our shortcomings and to make work of the problems finding solutions by adapting our processes, systems and structures, training our staff, and exerting better control over our activities.

We strive to exert control over the following:

- Provide feedback on all messages
- The placement of documents
- The eradication of duplicity

Over the following aspects we have no control, but you do have control:

- The reading and perusal of newsletters, parent guides, etc. in order to be familiar with your parental responsibilities thus helping us build our meaningful relationship.
- Please complete the correct enrolment forms (Delta instead of Impak or vice versa).
- Incomplete enrolment forms are submitted.
- Proof of payments are missing.
- Copies of Identity documents are missing.
- Late enrolments and work submitted after the closing dates. And then clients demand immediate service without considering our systems and procedures as stipulated.
- Clients submit answer books without the learner's full name on the answer book.
- Incomplete and undelivered mark sheets.

### **b. Transparency in service delivery through NUOVIDAS**

The effective flow and movement of information is vital for the functioning of any organisation. When the quantity of information becomes too cumbersome for hand to hand delivery and paper formats, computer technology is the answer.

Delta makes use of numerous systems to manage the tasks everyday. There were unfortunately gaps in our systems. We decided to build a new system that will replace the current systems with a single system, this system's name is NUOVIDAS.

The first step in the process was to lay a new foundation of user security (login and control of specific user functions), control and monitoring of changes to data. New functions are being placed on this foundation. Currently we are capturing all client information on the system providing us with control and a search function for tracking purposes. There are also numerous reports that users can view. We have just completed the integration of the system with our financial department. Client information is therefore fully synchronised making it faster to invoice and view payment details.

We look forward to the future development of the system which includes the access of clients to the system. This will remedy the paperwork crisis of re-enrolment, updating of contact details and the viewing of mark sheets and reports.

### c. Please make sure that you get quality service

It is with much pride that we share the positive developments in our client service department:

#### **d. Credit Card Payments**

#### **e. Deposit References**

Please use your client number with all payments. In the event that you have not received a client number, please use the account holder's ID number as reference, NOT THE GUARDIAN OR LEARNER'S ID NUMBER.

As soon as you have received the account, only the client number, which will be indicated on the account with your name and address, should be used on all further payments. This will ensure that payments are allocated to the correct account.

### **4. THE JUNE EXAMS ARE APPROACHING FAST**

Dr. Martin Human and his team of subject authors and moderators are going to great lengths to ensure that the exams and memoranda for the upcoming examination cycle are of the highest quality.

The postal process for the papers will begin on 17 May 2011. It usually takes two weeks for the process to be concluded.

It is necessary for our reports to be recognised by Umalusi, the Department of Education and the private sector. This means that we are accountable for the integrity of our exams.

The final report mark is determined by the following weighting: 25% year mark and 75% for the final exam.

The year mark is an average of the marks obtained in the March test cycle, June exam, September test cycle and the project and assignment marks. The parents are responsible for the calculation of the year mark and to send it to our Reports Department.

In order to guarantee the integrity of the final year mark, the year mark will be considered only if it is within 20% of the final exam mark. This implies that if a parent submits a mark of 85% for Maths for the year mark, but the learner achieves only 45% in his/her final exam, the year mark will be ignored. The final report mark will be 45%.

### **This is how you will implement the exam**

1. The memorandum will accompany the June exam. **Parents are to handle the examinations personally, protecting the integrity of the papers.** This is now your responsibility! In the event that the papers are marked by the parent/guardian on the same day as it was written, the memorandum should be a very good resource for future studies.
2. IT exams are not supplied on paper but on the Internet. Parents should be aware that the exams will be placed on the IT-forum in order to maintain the integrity of the paper. This is your responsibility! The subject can only be taken if your child has access to the internet.
3. The attached control form must be completed before your child commences with his/her exam.
4. Marking of papers:
  - a. **Gr. 0-3:** Papers are to be submitted for marking to ensure a professional report with regard to your child's progress.
  - b. **Gr. 4-11:** Parents and centres are responsible for the marking of these papers. If a parent feels uncomfortable about marking his/her child's exam, please send it to us.
  - c. **Gr. 12:** You may mark the papers. Please send us the year mark report. If a parent feels uncomfortable about marking his/her child's exam, please send it to us. Delta will return the marked papers to you if you have included a self addressed envelope with each paper. All papers are to be stored in your child's Portfolio of Evidence. This is your responsibility!
  - d. Mark sheets for the March test and June exams must be with Delta by 2 July and we will do our best to ensure that the reports are available by 28 July.
  - e. Mark sheets that are distributed with the papers must be completed and returned to Delta. Please return these mark sheets to [rapporte@impakonderwys.co.za](mailto:rapporte@impakonderwys.co.za) or fax them to 0865568595.
  - f. Please note that all papers sent via post must be done using registered post.
  - g. Finally, all papers that you would like to have returned must be accompanied by a self addressed envelope per subject.
  - h. **Enrichment subjects are not examinable.**

- i. The following is reflected on the mark sheet (Gr. 4-11):
  - i. March mark: Open book tests and the March test.
  - ii. June mark: All open book tests and assignments for the 2<sup>nd</sup> term.
  - iii. June exam: This is the June exam mark, whether it has been marked personally or by Delta.
- j. With regard to the Gr. 12 year mark report, only complete the March test and June exam mark.
- k. Please make copies of all mark sheets for your personal records before sending them to Delta.

### Assignments

- l. **Gr. 0-11:** All assignments are to be marked at home. Only mark sheets need to be submitted. Please store the assignments as they may be moderated at any time.
- m. **Gr. 12:** Assignments are marked personally. Please store all assignments in files per subject as they will be externally moderated in July.
- n. Gr. 10-12 Life Orientation assignments must be sent to Delta. Please ensure that they are complete and on time.

## 6. DELTA VOCATIONAL

**Delta Vocational** has taken off. The fundamentals were received with great enthusiasm and excitement. Learners can find their career calling by choosing a vocational career path qualification rather than a traditional National Senior Certificate (grade 12). Remember the workbook and portfolio in the Delta Vocational courses must be submitted for assessment and moderation at the end of April 2011.

### Tips to Remember

With the core subjects the practical component (logbook) can be completed in and signed by a business where the learner will work (without compensation) to ensure his/her practical experience (pertaining to your sector e.g. Wholesale & retail, construction, hairdressing,

welding, etc.). It is important to know that your 30% theory comprises of 3 days in the classroom (at home or learning centre) and 2 days at/in the workplace. Please parent/facilitator, use your discretion and give the learner the freedom to explore his/her own initiative to find answers outside the Learner Guide that will reflect some experience in the workplace. The logbook will be a guide to ensure the necessary practice of the required skill is attended to.

**The modules and units in the learner guide have activities that correspond with the workbook and portfolio.** Follow step by step activities in the Learner guide and workbook and portfolio to progress to the next level of knowledge. This process will continue to enhance the learners' skills (theoretical and practical) so that the ultimate goal of knowledge, process and product will be obtained.

Please find below a general overview of how we at Delta Vocational have divided the year and constructed our year programme. According to this division you will note that there is enough time to complete the work load comfortably. Furthermore we have included an **example** to assist you in planning your learners' day and week schedules. These study letters will address all the identified problem areas in every subject, serving as a preparation for the Prelims.

### 2. Winter Camp 1: Technological Camp

- ✓ Date: 27 June till the morning of 2 July.
- ✓ This camp is available for Delta and Impak learners of Grades 10-12.
- ✓ The practical exams for Grade 12 will be conducted in the relevant subjects. The candidates who do these practical exams, will serve as a control group. The marks of the candidates who don't attend the camp, and wish to do their practical exams at home (not recommended), will be adjusted to those of the control group. In this way the candidate who does the practical exams at the camp will have the advantage.
- ✓ Practical subjects that will be presented here, are Elect Tech, EGD, Mech Tech and Civil Tech.
- ✓ Academic subjects that will be presented here, are Eng Home Language and Eng 1st Add, Afr Home Language and Afr 1st Add, Maths, Maths Lit and Phys Science:
  - Electr Tech: 18 hours (4 hours are allocated for Gr 10 and 14 hours for Gr 11)

- EGD: 5 hours (2 hours are allocated for Gr 10 and 3 hours for Gr 11)
- Mech Tech: 18 hours (4 hours are allocated for Gr 10 and 14 hours for Gr 11)
- Civil Tech: 18 hours (4 hours are allocated for Gr 10 and 14 hours for Gr 11)
- Eng Home Language and 1st Add: 8 hours (2 hours are allocated for Gr 10 and 4 hours for Gr 11)
- Afr Home Language and 1st Add: 8 hours (2 hours are allocated for Gr 10 and 4 hours for Gr 11)
- Maths/Maths Lit: 8 hours (2 hours are allocated for Gr 10 and 4 hours for Gr 11)
- Phys Sc: 7 hours (2 hours are allocated for Gr 10 and 6 hours for Gr 11)

### 3. Winter Camp 2: Academic Camp Impak

- ✓ Date: 4 July till the morning of 9 July.
- ✓ This camp is only for Impak learners of Grades 10-12.
- ✓ The practical subjects that will be presented here, are Hospitality and Hairdressing.
- ✓ The candidates who do these practical exams, will serve as a control group. The marks of the candidates who don't attend the camp, and wish to do their practical exams at home (not recommended), will be adjusted to those of the control group. In this way the candidate who does the practical exams at the camp will have the advantage.
- ✓ Academic subjects that will be presented here, are Afr Home Language, Eng 1st Add, Maths, Maths Lit, Phys Sc, French, Economics, Geography, Life Sc, IT, CAT and Accounting.
- ✓ Allocation of time for each subject:
  - Afr Home Language, Eng 1st Add, Maths, Maths Lit, Phys Sc, French, CAT and IT: as far as possible 8 hours per subject (2 hours are allocated for Gr 10 and 4 hours for Gr 11)
  - Hospitality, Economics, Geography, Life Sc and Accounting: as far as possible 4 hours per subject (2 hours are allocated for Gr 10 and 3 hours for Gr 11)

### 4. Winter Camp 3: Academic Camp Delta

- ✓ Date: 11 July till the morning of 16 July.
- ✓ This camp is only for Delta learners of Grades 10-12 and has the same contents as Winter Camp 2.
- ✓ The only difference is the switch of the Home Languages.

### 5. Time management of the three camps

- The subject authors have enough time to thoroughly discuss the subjects with the candidates.
- Open periods: During these periods the candidates will do life skills.

### 6. Costs

- The cost for each camp is R400 for 5 full days and Saturday morning, including meals, programme and presentations, while transport costs (and any requirements for the technological camp as well as practical assessment) are excluded.
- Should a learner/candidate choose to make use of the scheduled transport between the head office of Delta and the farm, it will cost him/her R100 extra per return trip.

**7. What do we want to achieve with this camp?**

- We really want to deliver more Grade 12 candidates with Matric exemption for further studies.
- This is the reason why we spend more education time with our learners.
- We really want to have as many candidates at the camp as possible. That is why we make the camp attractive and present it at a reasonable rate.
- We want better control at the Winter Camp. A learner/candidate and his/her parents will sign a contract that they will comply with the rules and regulations of our camp. Should a Matric candidate transgress the rules, it can result in his/her deregistration.
- The rules include a specific programme and strict discipline:
  - ✓ We therefore start the camp correctly - with strict discipline.
  - ✓ Definitely no alcohol or drugs, as well as misbehaviour will be tolerated.
  - ✓ There will be a smoking area for smokers of 18 years of age and older - provided that they have a letter of consent signed by their parents.
- Everyone attending the camp, will receive a Camp Certificate at the conclusion of the camp.
- The camp leader and his team will be constructively busy with the learners on a non-stop level for most of the day.
- This camp replaces our present EGD camp, Winter School and Finishing School.
